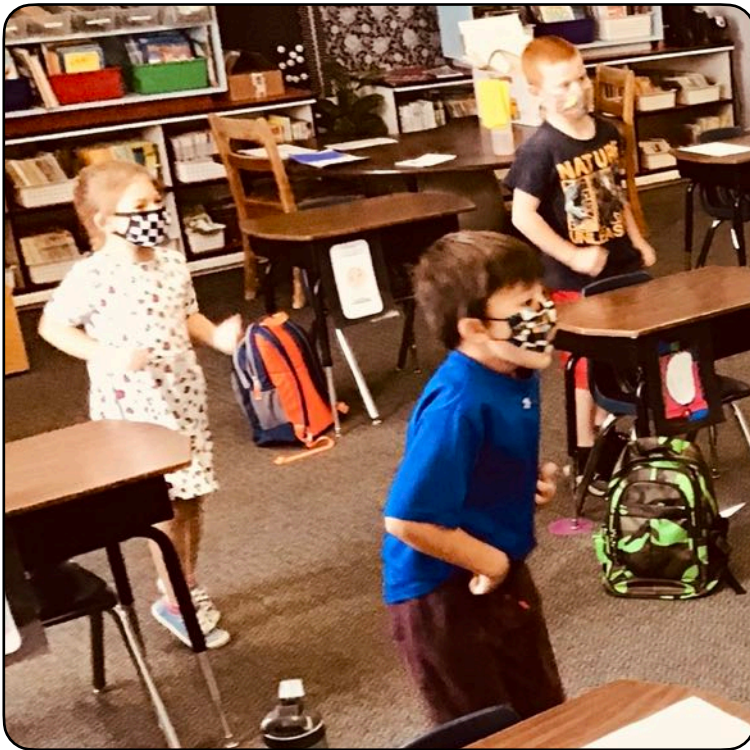


GO₂ Science

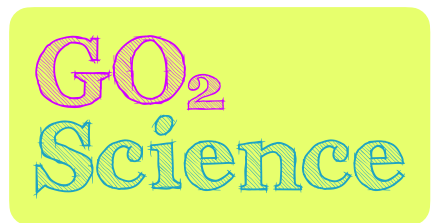
THE RESULT:
